

MANEA PARISH COUNCIL
Meeting – 25th September, 2006.

All councillors were present, together with Mr R Sears, Fenland District Councillor. Dr R Hirson and Mrs B Carson were also present.

Visitor – Mr Philip Eden who spoke about the Parish Plan. Mr Eden said the present Parish Plan was one of the early one produced. It was explained there was a steering group and thanks to the Manea Surgery and Dr Hirson the present plan was produced, printed and circulated in the village.

Mr Eden spoke at length about the process to produce a new plan and gave examples of plans from other villages.

It was agreed to set up a meeting with councillors and Dr Hirson and Mrs Carson to discuss the future, and whether the existing plan could be re-visited or whether a new process should begin.

Minutes of the meeting held on 21st August were confirmed and signed.

Matters Arising:

Highways -

Clerk has received e-mails both from Wimblington Parish Council and Geoffrey Harper, County Councillor concerning Boots Bridge, but no further information is forthcoming. Mr Sears said he would take this matter up at Fenland.

Letter from Highway Supervisor saying he has arranged for the trees at Purls Bridge road to be reduced in height. He also explained the street lighting at the development at 7 Westfield Road was the responsibility of the developer and 3 new lights are to be erected and adopted by the County Council.

It was reported the hedge in front of the old police house in High Street overhangs the footpath. Also the willow trees at 96 Westfield Road overhang the path and when wet water falls on passers by, it was also reported the bushes at 26 High Street overhang the footpath here also. Clerk to report to Highways.

Open space – 25 Station Road a meeting was held with Mr Goodyear from Hazelmere Homes. It was agreed to leave the space open, the trees will be trimmed and protective fencing put around them. Some new flowering trees will be planted as well as a border along the rear. Three new “no ball games” signs will be erected and a memorial plaque “Dicks Garden” put on the corner with School Lane. After two years the open space should become the responsibility of Fenland Council. Mr Cole met with Mr Goodyear to discuss a fence in front of the playing field but nothing further has come of this yet.

Discussion followed on the open space at Thanes Rest and Rutland way. Mr Sears hopes to have a meeting with Fenland Officers about this shortly.

Playing Field – conifer hedge – estimates for cutting this were to hand. From Peterborough Tree Services - £900 + VAT. Mr P Clarke and Mr P Deaves offered to cut one side of the hedge by hand, providing council provided a cherry picker, at a cost of £800. Mr Savage had been asked to quote, but this has not been received. It was proposed by Mrs Desborough, seconded by Mr Cole we accept the quote from Peterborough Tree Services.

Mr Cole took the invoice and letter to the parents of the young person who damaged the wiring and sensor. He will check with Mr Yardy that this has been paid.

Mr Emery said he had been asked if someone from the village could use the pavilion on Saturday for a birthday party. This was agreed, providing a donation is made to the council.

Cemetery - the new sign has been erected. New watering cans have been ordered from Ridgeons and the caretaker has tidied up the site around the water tap.

Chatteris & Manea Task Group – Mr Hawkins used to represent the council at these meetings – Mr Archer offered to attend in his place.

5 *Glebe Close* letter from Cambridge Housing Society – saying they were under impression houses had to be offered to people with Manea connection but could find no written record of this. They did find old minutes of 1991 when it was mentioned. As it was not a written agreement they had to follow Fenland's nomination and offer the house to people with no local connection. Clerk has e-mailed Tim Mills Head of Housing and he says if he could see a copy of these minutes he would look further into the matter. Clerk to also look in old parish minutes to see if anything is minuted there.

Allotments application for the vacant 4 acres at Cranmore from Mr and Mrs C Howell. It was proposed by Mr Emery, seconded by Mr Cole they be offered the tenancy.

Manea Pit - e-mail from Mr Shelton saying he was surprised council had to consult village as this matter had been going on for so long. He asked for dates to consider for meeting council – 11th and 18th October were put forward

Railway update from Mr Archer. He had the results of the recent survey which he has sent to Mr Wilkinson from Fenland Council's rural transport dept. He is also meeting with a lady from Downham Market who is keen to form a rail users group. Mr Sears is also exploring avenues to see if more trains can stop at Manea.

Burial fees – were discussed – it was proposed by Mrs Desborough, seconded by Mr Risbridger that these be increased 25% rounded up to the nearest £5. This was agreed by all.

Audit Report – the external auditor has made comment that he feels the fidelity guarantee should be increased to take account of the large cash balance in council funds. It was therefore agreed this should be done immediately and the amount increased to £80,000. It was proposed by Mrs Palmby, seconded by Mr Archer the report be accepted.
